

(1-B) International Creator Residency Program 2023 (Theme Projects)

Application Outline

Tokyo Arts and Space (TOKAS), operated by a division of The Museum of Contemporary Art Tokyo, offers artist-in-residence programs for international creators working in various creative fields to stay, engage in creation and conduct research activities. It also provides creators with the opportunities to exchange creative ideas and to present outcomes of their residency at TOKAS-organized events, such as the Open Studio.

The open-call program “International Creator Residency Program” (Theme Projects) for the period from May to July 2023 aims to invite two distinguished and highly motivated international creators in the field of visual art, film, design, and architecture who would engage in creative activities based on the theme **“Ecology around the city.”** At the same time, we will call for two local creators in Japan who would stay at TOKAS Residency under the “Local Creator Residency Program” to work on the same theme during the same period. The four creators will have an opportunity to exchange ideas and have a dialogue based on the theme, while working independently on their own projects. The result of their residency will be presented at the Open Studio and/or the Result Presentation.

1. Project Theme: **“Ecology around the city”**

Our environment is facing a huge turning point. Amid the decarbonization trend, recent trends such as questioning our assumption towards flying long distances by plane and the rapid diffusion of digitalization have had a great impact on our society, as well as on our lives and mentalities. Environmental issues were taken up gradually in the 1970s, and in the 1990s, various frameworks against global warming were formulated. French thinker Félix Guattari suggested the idea of “*écosophie*,” a word coined by combining “*écologie*” and “*philosophie*,” in his book entitled “*Les trois ecologies*” (first published in 1989). Using this word, Guattari raised the necessity to perceive ecology as a complex notion which spans three domains, including not only the global environment but also the social and human spiritual environments.

Tokyo is faced with multiple dangers of natural disasters: there is a 70-percent probability of a massive earthquake occurring beneath the Tokyo metropolitan area within 30 years, and approximately a third of Tokyo’s 23 wards are at risk of being flooded due to a storm surge caused by a “super typhoon.” By considering topics around this city’s ecology such as the relation among nature, society, and people as well as the balance and challenges between economy and ecology from various aspects, the set of values, thoughts embedded in the people, and even a picture of society as a collective may emerge. Such discoveries may

lead to obtaining clues for a co-existing future among various environments.

TOKAS now calls for creators from various backgrounds who will work on the theme and seek to actively exchange ideas on the cultural differences in thoughts, recognitions, actions and languages while engaging in creative activities in Tokyo/Japan during their stay at TOKAS Residency from May to July 2023. We hope that the program provides an opportunity to examine the underlying phenomena of our customs and societies in the metropolis Tokyo, a city where diverse identities intersect, through the framework of ecology around the city.

2. Target for this program

This program is aimed at those creators

- who are willing to explore new creative activities.
- who practice in any of the following cultural/ artistic fields:
visual art, film, design, architecture.

4. What TOKAS Residency offers

Living space (single room), shared studio, airfare, living expenses (per diem) and fee for creative work/project

-Airfare: A round-trip economy-class air ticket between the nearest airport from the place of residence and Tokyo (either Narita or Haneda Airport) will be provided.

-Living expenses (per diem): JPY 3,500 (consumption tax excluded) per day

-Fee for work/project: JPY 300,000 (consumption tax excluded)

*Income tax will be deducted from the above amounts.

* The single room will be provided for the stay by the participating creator only. A twin bed room will be provided to creators applying as a duo.

5. Eligibility

- ① Resides outside of Japan.
- ② Has 5 years or more of experience in his/her specialized area of expertise.
- ③ Has sufficient ability to communicate in English with other residing creators and TOKAS

Residency staff for mutual understanding.

- ④ Independent and capable of working and living on his/her own.
- ⑤ Creators working as a duo are also eligible. (Duo consisting of at least one creator residing outside of Japan is eligible.)
- ⑥ Students are ineligible (except for Ph.D. candidates).

6. Requirements/Conditions

- ① Able to stay consecutively at TOKAS Residency during the proposed residency period.
- ② Shall create the work based on the theme to be presented at Open Studio and submit a comprehensive report on the proposed project.
- ③ Participate in the Result Presentation and other programs if asked by TOKAS, and cooperates with its public relations activity.
- ④ Do not carry out any commercial or profitable activities throughout the residency period.
- ⑤ Do not conduct any activities that would make big noise or vibration in TOKAS Residency.
- ⑥ The Accommodation is provided for the participating creator only. Family members, partners, friends or guests are not permitted to stay at TOKAS Residency.

7. Application Deadline

Deadline to submit documents: July 26, 2022, 18:00 (JST)

Deadline to submit support materials: August 2, 2022, 23:00 (JST)

8. Selection Schedule

Selection stage: review with external juries in the end of August, 2022

*The successful applicants will be informed of their final results individually by the end of September, 2022.

The final results will be announced through our website at the beginning of October, 2022.

*We do not respond to any individual inquiries on the selection process and result.

- ② Two letters of recommendation (.pdf file): have to be prepared by two different referees (stated in “2) Referee in Application Form 2”) from art and cultural institutions, related educational organizations, or professionals specialized in the fields of art and culture.

*Letters must include signatures of the referees, written in either English or Japanese in A4 format.

*Please send the scanned PDF files of letters by July 26, 2022.

- ③ Support materials: referring to Manual (.pdf file), send support materials stated in “12) Past Projects in Application Form 2”.

*Any application which does not meet the requirements stated in this outline will not be accepted.

*Application is non-returnable.
