The Tokyo Metropolitan Government and the Tokyo Metropolitan Foundation for History and Culture are carrying out this exhibition as part of the Tokyo Tokyo FESTIVAL.

Since 2006, Tokyo Arts and Space (TOKAS) has been implementing the “Creator-in-Residence” residency program, which offers opportunities for creators active in various disciplines including visual art, design, and curation to stay and create works in Tokyo or at various overseas destinations.

In 2020, it became difficult to go abroad due to the COVID-19 pandemic, thus most of our residency programs were either postponed or cancelled. The creators, who inevitably had to stay where they were due to the travel restriction, some extended their stay while others faced difficulty in the tense situation, or had to give up travelling. Also TOKAS conducted our first online residency during restricted admission to the country from overseas. This exhibition will feature those 5 creators who participated in our residency programs in 2019 - 2021.

## ■ Exhibition Overview

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The rapid movement of everyday life which, due to the bewildering speed of information updates and technological advances, seems to have transcended physical distance, has been abruptly transformed into a stagnant society. Due to the pandemic, the world has unexpectedly become one, while at the same time becoming more fragmented.

For TOKAS, which implements residency programs in cooperation with various organizations around the world, time passed differently in 2020 than it ever had in the past. The artists we are introducing in this edition became involved in the program, based on different conditions in circumstances, where traveling and physical exchange were limited.

By setting their sights on social realities, which in some cases have been buried in a dark hole, and shedding light on them, the artists strive to discover what is actually happening in the world that we live in, and how we might confront it. When they listen closely to the voices of people in different societies, the artists' myriad experiences, which have led to various realizations about their surroundings, can provide us with new illumination when they are presented in the form of an artwork.

These scoops of light help us visualize a world that we have previously overlooked, presenting it as a single entity without divisions or clear borders. It has always been existing but has not been caught by our eyes. This fact rises up like a glimmer of dust, catching the light as it floats through the air, and making us aware of our surroundings.

## FUNAI Misa

**Tokyo-Berlin Exchange Residency Program**  
**\*Cancelled due to the COVID-19 pandemic.**

Following her initial plan to “Consider Japan from the vantage point of Germany,” Funai integrates fragments of thought accumulated thus far in the form of an installation employing diverse elements. Based on personal family memories and impulses emerging from experience, she considers a range of issues – the flow of time from past to present, history, culture, the modernization of Asia, women, family, society and life – and their future development.

## KIKUCHI Tomoko

**Tokyo-Seoul Exchange Residency Program**  
**Residency Period: 2019.5 - 7**

Kikuchi presents a multi-channel video work dealing with the themes of past trauma, how people live with and overcome it, and how people share the burden of suffering, through the narratives of North Koreans living in South Korea and children born to North Korean and Chinese parents. Kikuchi, who has been unable to leave South Korea due to the coronavirus pandemic, explores boundaries and divisions newly brought to light through interactions with the local residents.

Yuju decided to face the anti-Asian discrimination issue, triggered by her own experience in Berlin while participating in the residency program. She is now back in Berlin to live and work, and in this exhibition she presents a video work responding to the discrimination through the lens of the Asian MeToo movement.

Featured in this exhibition is a series of his works based on research on people of Arab descent living in Tokyo, and on images of Japan and their own home countries that become visible from the perspective of an expatriate.
